

Mobile Wifi Hotspots are now available to checkout. A mobile hotspot is a portable gadget that allows nearby wifi devices (ie.g., laptop, ipad, iphone, android) to connect to the internet. When you checkout a hotspot, vou can use it at home, in your

car on the move, in a park, anywhere there is 3G or 4G coverage, all free of charge, for 21 days.





GETTING TO KNOW THE COMPUTER








This is a six-session class and participants are encouraged to attend every session.




The library is pleased to host local realtor Jeff Earley for a special "Open House" talk on how to prepare your home for the market — and to make sure the price is right for your wallet!



free eclipse glasses!

The program will start in Snyder Park with up-close viewing of the sun using solar telescopes and other fun eclipse related activities. At 7 PM, we will move to the community room for a solar observing and eclipse talk, given by Larry McHenry.

This program will include an introduction to solar features visible on our nearest star, the Sun, and safe solar observing techniques, using both white-light and H-alpha solar filters. Additionally, we'll discuss where to go and how to observe the upcoming April 8th, 2024 Total Solar Eclipse.


